JESUS RESTORES A DEMON-POSSESSED MAN week 4 Mark 5:1-20

Inspection – “What does it say?”

Where did the man with demons live? Why? Do we see this today?

What is the background of the demon's name?

What was the end outcome of the pigs and the demons?

How does this event answer the disciples' question in Mark 4:41?

What is the balance between the economic loss of pigs and the message of the gospel?

Observation – “What does it mean?”

What obvious challenges might there have been for the people of the town to put faith in Jesus?

What lesson do we learn from Jesus' command in verse 19?

Has God ever said “No” to your request and used it for good?

How does naming our sins help us overcome our sin? Reference 1 John 1:9

Why are we reluctant to share what Jesus has done for us?

Life Application – “What does it mean for me?”

Identify any prejudice in your life and pray that God would deliver you.

Make a list of what God has done for you. Remember to thank Him in your prayers.

Sacrifice something of value to bring the message of Jesus to others.

Venture to “the other side of the lake” to share the power of Jesus.

Recognize how God uses storms to move us in the direction of the lost.
