Do a study on the word “way” from verse 20. Compare Acts 19:9, Acts 19:23, and Acts 24:14.

Read Leviticus 14:33-57 and consider what Jesus has done for you.

Encourage someone who has fallen away from meeting with other Christians.

Read Matthew 25:31-46 and meditate on God’s righteous judgement.

Attend two worship gatherings on the Lord’s Day and meet new believers.
