WEEK 5 | INVITED TO THE TABLE | LUKE 14-15-24

INSPECTION: WHAT DOES IT SAY?

Who was sitting at the table with Jesus in verse 15? Reference Luke 14:1-14 According to Jesus, what is the result of eating at the feast in the kingdom of God? Who was responsible for inviting guests to the Great Banquet? What three excuses are used for not attending the Great Banquet? How many groups of people are sent an invitation to the Great Banquet?

OBSERVATION: WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

What does the nature of God's invitations say about Him? What excuses have you made in refusing God's invitation? How can the unimportant and urgent vs the important and not urgent rob God? What emotional effect should being invited to the Great Banquet cause? Read Matthew 10:34-42 How does this passage reflect Jesus' teaching on priorities?

LIFE APPLICATION: WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR ME?

Make a list of invitations that Jesus offers to those who follow Him Plan a meal and invite friends in Christ and outside of Christ to participate Consider how communion could be viewed in the context of this story Invite someone this week to meet you at Fairmount to enjoy fellowship with Jesus Pray daily to keep Jesus at the center of your attention and work
