

WEEK 2 | GOD'S RIGHTEOUS JUDGMENT | ROMANS 2:1-16

INSPECTION: WHAT DOES IT SAY?

Read verses 2, 6, and 11. What three standards of judgment will God use?

What is the purpose of God's kindness, forbearance, and patience as seen in verse 4?

According to verse 7, what three things should we persistently seek?

What law do the Gentiles follow apart from the Jewish law?

Read verse 16. What will God judge on the Great Day of Judgment?

OBSERVATION: WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

List some way God's judgment should impact your everyday life.

What does it mean to "pass judgment" on someone else? Reconcile Matthew 7:15-20.

What safeguards are there when it comes to a stubborn and unrepentant heart?

What part does "doing good" (verse 7) play in a person's salvation? Is this a works-based salvation?

From where does our conscience come? How does a conscience "accuse and defend" as mentioned in verse15?

LIFE APPLICATION: WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR ME?

Write a few paragraphs on what the Great Judgment means to you and share with a friend.

Pray daily that God will soften your conscience.

Start a list of God's kindnesses toward you and review it often.

Consider what secrets you keep from God and others. Confess your secrets to God.

Read James 3:1-12 daily this week.

A Prayer for Forgiveness
