

WEEK 3 | JESUS: SAVIOR FOR ALL | NUMBERS 21:4-9

Inspection: What Does It Say?

What virtue did the people lack in verse 4? Why did the people complain and criticize God and Moses in verse 5? What was God's response in verse 6? What was the response of the people to the venomous snakes in verse 7? What was the response of God to those who repented in verses 8 and 9?

Observation: What Does It Mean?

How does frustration in life cause us to take our eyes off Jesus? How did this event in verses 8-9 point forward to Jesus? Compare John 3:14-15. How do we see faith and obedience at work in those who were healed? How does this account demonstrate the grace of God? Is our salvation a simple plan, complex plan, or both?

Life Application: What Does It Mean For Me?

Make a list of those thing that cause you to take your eyes off Jesus and pray for God's help. Google "The Serenity Prayer" and repeat daily this week. Turn your complaining list over to God and leave it there. Read John 12:20-36 and compare to Numbers 21:4-9. Consider how you lift up Jesus in your daily life and pray for boldness.
