What does Romans 5:1-2 say is necessary to receive justification?

What connection is there between Leviticus 16:4, Hebrews 10:22, and Acts 22:16?

Life Application – “What does it mean for me?”

Consider how to weave blue (faithfulness), scarlet (sacrifice), and purple (righteousness) in your life.

Read John 20 and consider how the resurrection changes your life.
