Inspection – “What does it say?”

For what two reasons did the crowds come to Jesus?

Where did Jesus go following the healing of the man with leprosy?

Observation – “What does it mean?”

Read Leviticus 5:1-4. Did Jesus break the Law by touching a leper?

How do we see God’s grace and man’s obedience working together in the text?

How is it possible not to be lonely in a lonely place?

Based on verse 14, how can God’s healing in our lives be a testimony to others?

According to Leviticus 13:45-46, lepers lived “outside the camp.” How do we see that happening today?

Life Application – “What does it mean for me?”

Consider how your sin has separated you from others and pray for restoration.

Consider how Jesus separated Himself from the crowds to pray and follow His example.

Consider how you can spread the good news about Jesus.

Visit someone who is sick or in need of encouragement.

Pray daily that God will give you compassion for the hurting and outcast.
