

WEEK 4 | PEACE ON EARTH | LUKE 2:1-21

Inspection – "What does it say?"

According to verse 14, to what extent does the Glory of God reach?

On whom does God's favor rest? (verse 14)

What does verse 19 reveal about Mary's heart?

According to verse 21, when was Jesus given His name?

What is the meaning of His name?

How many ways did the message of God's favor affect the actions of the shepherds?

Observation – "What does it mean?"

Of what would the heavenly host be aware that shepherds could not imagine? How is peace a by-product of something greater?

What is another word for God's favor in Scripture? Why is God so favorable?

What might be the reason the name of "Jesus" was revealed to Mary before His conception? (verse 21)

When does peace come into the life of those on the earth?

Life Application – "What does it mean for me?"

Consider the events surrounding Jesus' birth and how timely

Jesus' peace was (and still is) needed.

Pray for peace in the many areas of conflict and war in our world.

Ask God to change your heart to show favor on all people.

Post a message of peace on your social media this week.

Stop in this Christmas season and practice a James 1:27 approach to your celebration.

Supplication: What Can We Meditate?

Keep alive within us the flame of hope so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division," "hatred," and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother," and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam!
