What is the importance of prayer in the spread of the Gospel?

How is the Gospel of Jesus Christ and faith connected to salvation?

# Life Application – "What does it mean for me?"

Consider what evidence there is that the will of God is being lived out in your life.

Develop a strategic plan to tell others about Jesus and bathe it in prayer.

Plan a "reveal" gathering with friends outside of Christ and share Jesus.

Evaluate how you use social media to tell others about Jesus.
